For the past two years you have heard a lot about the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund. Through your generosity our parishes have raised close to a million dollars for the Fund. To date 11 projects have received grants from the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund. The newest grant recipient is the *Métis Artist Collective* who is hosting *Reconciliation Through Art* on September 30th at the Mississippi Valley Textile Museum (3 Rosamond Street East.)
