MESSAGE FOR THE JUBILEE YEAR 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall,

The year 2025 will be a special time for our Church, a Jubilee Year during which we are called to be "Pilgrims of Hope." The Jubilee is a moment of grace, an invitation to renew our faith and walk together toward a brighter future.
