KEY TO MASS CELEBRATIONS

- (S) Solemnity – Is the highest rank of Celebration of events in our Lord's life on earth and that of certain saints.
- (F) Feast – Are of second importance and consist of the celebration of certain saints
- (M) Memorial – These are Obligatory and are for those saints who are of “universal significance” and are observed by the whole Church.
- (OM) Optional Memorial – Not Obligatory. The National Conference of Catholic Bishops publishes an annual Ordo that outlines proper celebrations throughout the liturgical year.
