FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Missing Piece" Series

Week Four: Do You Feel God is Approachable?

We can have peace in our lives because God is with us in the person of Jesus Christ, who has saved us from our sins. God is always offering us his peace and extending his peace. His greatest peace offering was sending his Son into the world to save us from our sins. In this message, we will look at how accepting the presence and plan of God brings peace into our lives.

- Know? Peace is at the heart of Advent, and all that we have reflected on (God's vision of peace, our call to be peacemakers, and the gift of peace in our hearts) flows from one essential truth: peace with God. Through Jesus, whose very name means "God saves," our sins are forgiven, giving us a fresh start. He is Emmanuel, God with us and for us, who draws near instead of keeping His distance. And like Joseph, we are invited to cooperate with God's plan, trusting that He has chosen us to play a part in His saving work.
- Feel? This message invites us to feel reassured and hopeful. God is not distant, angry, or uninterested in us. He has already acted to wipe away our sins, come close to us in love, and draw us into His purposes. No matter our past or our flaws, we can feel confidence and joy knowing that God's desire is peace with us and for us.
- Next Steps? We are challenged to respond like Joseph by saying yes to God's plan and cooperating with His will. That begins with accepting His forgiveness and presence in our own lives. It continues by embracing even small opportunities to be part of His mission, such as inviting others to encounter Christ at Christmas. This week, the most practical step we can take is to extend an invitation, whether in person, with a paper card, or online, so that others may experience the peace of Christ this Christmas.



MERRY CHRISTMAS, FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Merry Christmas from Fr. John and Fr. Jonathan!

Thank you to all who took part in our "Missing Piece" Series, and in finding our peace with God in Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Christmas invites us to pause from the busyness of the season and receive God's greatest gift—peace through Jesus Christ. True peace is not the absence of problems but the presence of God, who is both greater than our struggles and close to us in love. In the humility of the manger, we see that Christ came for all people, offering a peace the world cannot give and cannot take away. This Christmas, we are invited to welcome Him as Savior and accept His gift of lasting peace.

- Know? Christmas is about the arrival of peace through Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the world. True peace is not found in quiet moments, favourable circumstances, or the absence of problems. It is found in the presence of God. In the birth of Christ, we see both the transcendence of God, who is bigger than all our struggles, and the closeness of God, who comes near to us in humility as a child in a manger.
- Feel? This message invites us to feel relief, hope, and reassurance. Even if we come into Christmas weary, anxious, or unsettled, we are reminded that God is bigger than our fears, griefs, and conflicts, and at the same time, He is near and cares deeply about us. We are encouraged to feel awe at God's greatness and comfort in His nearness, leading us to rest in the peace only He can give.
- Next Steps? We are called to accept God's gift of peace in the person of Jesus Christ. That begins with opening our hearts in prayer and personally inviting Christ to be present in our lives. It continues as we walk with others in faith, through the Church, small groups, or friendships that keep us rooted in God's presence. This Christmas, the invitation is simple: ask for His peace, welcome Him as Saviour, and carry His presence into daily life.

THE INTENTIONS OF THE HOLY FATHER

For Christians in areas of conflict – Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation and hope.
