KEY TO MASS CELEBRATIONS

- (S) Solemnity – Is the highest rank of Celebration of events in our Lord's life on earth and that of certain saints.
(F) Feast – Are of second importance and consist of the celebration of certain saints
(M) Memorial – These are Obligatory and are for those saints who are of "universal significance" and are observed by the whole Church.
(OM) Optional Memorial – Not Obligatory. The National Conference of Catholic Bishops publishes an annual Ordo that outlines proper celebrations throughout the liturgical year.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As our celebration of Christmas continues, today we observe the great Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word *epiphany* comes from the Greek and means “manifestation” or “appearance.” This feast reminds us that God continues to reveal Himself - not only to the Magi long ago, but in our own lives today. The stewardship way of life is our grateful response to these countless manifestations of God’s presence and love.

In today’s Gospel from Matthew, the Magi show us what faithful stewardship looks like. They are attentive and watchful: “We have seen his star at its rising.” Good stewards learn to notice the “stars” in their own lives - the signs of God’s guidance, blessing, and invitation. This awareness naturally leads to gratitude, worship, and a desire to share God’s gifts with others.

When the Magi recognize God’s presence, they are “overjoyed.” This is not a shallow or passing happiness, but a deep and lasting joy that flows from encountering Christ. It is the joy that sustains us, even in times of change or uncertainty.

Finally, the Magi respond by offering their treasures in worship. Their generosity flows from awe and love, reminding us that stewardship is not about obligation, but about giving ourselves freely to God.

As we celebrate this feast, we also lift up our prayers for Fr. John, who will be away for a month on vacation. May this time be one of rest, renewal, and blessing. We are grateful for the generous support of Fr. Pat and Msgr. Sean, who will be offering their help during Fr. John’s absence. May God protect all our clergy, refresh their spirits, and continue to bless our parishes through their faithful service.

Let us remain attentive to God’s presence and generous in sharing our gifts as we continue our journey in the year ahead.
